# The Law

- Kinds of contrats : CDD (Fixed-term contract), CDI (permanent contract), temporary work, seasonal contract, harvest contrat.
- Full time (35h/week) or part time (less than 35h/week)
- SMIC at 1st January 2024 : 1 801,80€ bruts  
(= 1 426,30€ nets)

Brut = before taxes / Net = after taxes (amount you really get on your bank account)



# My job and my rights

- Student Job and scholarships can be cumulative

Notice that the amount of the scholarship might decrease if you earn in one year 3 times the monthly amount of the SMIC ( >4 278,90€)

- Housing Allowances : APL (Aide personnalisée au logement) and ALS (allocation au logement sociale) = depending on your salary :

**Beware** : as a scholarship student, you have to be regular in the classes (exams, internship ...). Your studies have to be your priority.

# International Students



- European : can work without specific process or restriction
- Non-European : Having a student resident permit-maxi 964h/ year  
(= 60% of the legal annual number of hours)
- Algerian : Having a certificate of résidence – maxi 803h /year (=50% de legal annual number of hours),

The employer has to make a request for a work permit (Autorisation Provisoire de Travail = APT)

Students from UK are now considered as Extra-European students,



## Specific status : Employed student

- Having a professional regular activity (at less 60h/month or 120h/trimester =10 à 15h/week)
- Contract begins before 1st October, for the whole year-> until 30th September
- Possible arrangements: waiver of attendance at certain tutorials, adapted timetable, etc.

## PARTICULAR CASES:

### Internship

For the internship mandatory in your studies, the hours won't be deducted from the 964h/year (even if you receive a grant)

### Apprenticeship or professional contract

If the number of hours stipulated in the contract exceeds 964 hours/year for an international student from a non-European country -> the employer must ask for a work permit here : [le site du ministère de l'Intérieur](#).

\*For Algerian student, the employer has to make a request for a work permit (Autorisation provisoire de travail : APT) whatever how many hours they work.

# Beware



## NEVER:

- ⊘ Accept to be paid in cash
- ⊘ Accept to conduct financial transactions for the employer
- ⊘ Give personal information for a job interview (passport, identity card, bank details, social security number, bank card number, code, etc.)
- ⊘ Send money to the employer
- ⊘ Purchase equipment at your own expense to work
- ⊘ Agree to be paid in advance for a job/assignment (cash money order payment or cheques)
- ⊘ Call a taxed number if the employer asks you to contact him
